Bowel Cancer Awareness Week

1 in 12 Australians will be diagnosed with bowel cancer by age 85. Both men and women are at risk of developing the disease. Bowel cancer claims 80 lives every week in Australia. Bowel cancer is curable if detected and treated early.

Over 50? Family history? Symptoms? Talk to your doctor.

Bowel cancer is diagnosed in more than 3,400 Victorians every year. It mostly affects people over 50 years of age but it can happen in younger people. Bowel cancer usually begins in the lining of the colon or rectum. If untreated, it spreads deeper into the wall of the bowel. From there, it can spread to lymph nodes in the area. Later, bowel cancer can spread to the liver or lungs.

The most common symptoms of bowel cancer are: blood or mucus in the faeces; an unexpected change in bowel habit (for example, diarrhoea or constipation for no obvious reason); general discomfort in the abdomen (feelings of bloating, fullness and/or cramps); constant tiredness; weakness and paleness.

The risk factors include: getting older – bowel cancer more commonly affects people over the age of 50; having a personal or strong family history of bowel cancer; having ulcerative colitis (inflamed colon lining) for more than eight to 10 years.

In the early stages, bowel cancer often causes no symptoms. People at relatively high risk of bowel cancer can arrange with their doctor to have regular tests to check that everything is OK.

You can help to reduce your risk of bowel cancer by eating a healthy diet, including plenty of vegetables and fruit and only small amounts of animal fat; maintaining a healthy body weight; exercising regularly and not smoking.

Bowel cancer screening is now accessible to all Victorians over 50. The screening test that is used is called the faecal occult blood test (FOBT). This is a simple test for the early signs of bowel cancer. It involves taking tiny samples from two or three bowel motions using a test kit. The samples are collected at home and then sent to a laboratory for testing. To find out more, contact The Cancer Council Helpline on 131 120.

Pure Local Energy



The sun has been captured in the Murrindindi Shire

Murrindindi Shire residents have been looking to the sun as the Pure Local Energy buying group takes hold and interest significantly grows.

Facilitated by the North East Greenhouse Alliance, Solar Shop Australia has recently conducted community information sessions in Alexandra and Kinglake West, which have explained how local residents could turn their roof into a mini power station and help save the environment and reduce their electricity bills significantly.

Solar Shop Australia's national manager for rural and regional Australia, Richard Inwood said that there has been great interest in the program from Murrindindi Shire residents.

"Many residents have been particularly interested in the different solar technologies available," Mr Inwood said. "The majority of residents ultimately choose the Kaneka thin-film panels because they have greater electricity output than older technology crystalline panels and they cover more roof area which gives an additional roof insulating effect.

"Kaneka panels also work best in the Australian climate as they produce more power in the searing Australian heat and are shade tolerant," he said.

Residents who have limited roof space have been looking at new generation hybrid technologies.

"Hybrid panels take in the benefits of both the thin-film panels and traditional crystalline panels," Mr Inwood said. "They are almost as efficient as the thin-film Kaneka panels and take up significantly less roof space".

The Pure Local Energy program is drawing to close as the Federal Government's \$8000 rebate ends as of 30 June. Residents who have a combined household income less than \$100,000 should look to apply for the rebate now to ensure they maximise their savings.

"A fully refundable \$100 deposit is all that is required to lock in the amazing pricing for a premium solar system and gives all local homeowners the opportunity to take advantage of the Pure Local Energy project," Mr Inwood said.

In Peter's group of 4 to hit off at Marysville on Saturday were David Robinson (Men's Captain), Rob Christie (Course Superintendent) and Liz Amos (Ladies' Captain).

"Peter was so pleasant to play with, very gracious" says Liz "It was wonderful to play with him. When I was younger golf spectators were able to walk with the tournament players and I watched him when he was at his peak and never ever thought I'd have the opportunity, 40 years later, to play with him. Peter still has the same smooth, easy swing and timing."

Rob Christie won the day with 22points. Ladies winner was Gail Leigh with 16 points. The real winner was Marysville Golf and Bowls Club who were honoured to have Peter and the many VIP's visit for the day. "Peter made the promise to come and he came!"
