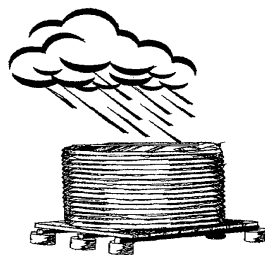

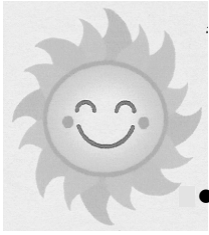

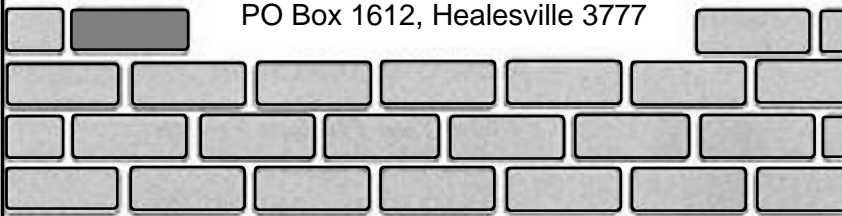

The State and Federal Governments joined forces this week to announce a \$600,000 allocation to Murrindindi and Mitchell Shires to assist in the recovery of the tourist areas affected by the fires in February. This funding will provide a much needed boost towards promoting the attractions of the areas, inviting visitors to return and to support the local businesses which rely on the tourist trade. We thank the governments and welcome the injection of funds to such a vital industry of our shires.

The Murrindindi Shire Council and the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority continue on their shared journey of rebuilding our shire. Both organisations fully appreciate the importance of working hand in hand and we all have the best interests of the shire and the united goal in mind. Together we will rebuild.

Go Red For Women

Wear red on June 12th to raise awareness of the risk of heart disease in women.

Did you know that heart disease is the number 1 killer of Australian women? If this is news to you, you're not alone. In fact, most women do not know that heart disease is the leading cause of death for Australian women.

The Go Red for Women campaign plans to turn this around by uniting Australian women in the fight against heart disease – raising awareness of their risk and helping them make healthier choices.

Your heart needs care for life. A healthy heart is about enjoying a healthy lifestyle and making this part of your everyday life. It is also about taking positive steps to reduce risk factors. The good news is that if you lead a healthy lifestyle you can reduce your risk of developing heart disease.

Small changes to your eating habits can make a big difference. Try switching to reduced fat milk instead of full fat milk, ditching the cakes or biscuits for morning tea and choosing a piece of fruit or opting for wholegrain bread instead of white.

Look for ways to build physical activity into your day. Walk or ride a bike instead of driving. If you must drive, park further away and walk the extra distance rather than driving around for the perfect park, or take a break during the day and go for a 15 minute walk.

Review the changes you've made and note how you are feeling. Changes should be long term so it's important to be enjoying your life and feeling good about yourself.

Reward yourself – when a change becomes a habit, buy yourself some new clothes, or visit a place you enjoy.

Keep going with your changes – it's normal to have days when it all becomes too hard, but don't worry about it. Just keep going with your changes the next day.

Shire Bushfire Roadside Tree Cleanup Nearing Completion

The massive tree cleanup job required after the Black Saturday Bushfires on the Murrindindi Shire's roadsides is nearing completion.

Murrindindi Shire Council's Operations Engineer, Peter Cownley, who is in charge of tree cleanup operations says with more than 40% of the Shire of Murrindindi affected by the bushfires the task has been massive and it was heartening to see things returning to normal.

Peter anticipates that most of the Council co-ordinated roadside tree clean up works will be completed by the end of June.

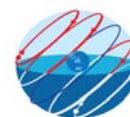
Council has been diligent in its efforts to preserve roadside trees. Our objective is to preserve as many trees as possible. Council engaged contract arborists to assess each tree with all options, including pruning, reviewed before a removal is authorised. Anyone with concerns about roadside trees on council roads is encouraged to contact Council.

In Marysville, one of the worst affected townships, specialist cleanup teams have been working for many weeks on the enormous task of clearing the dead and fallen trees. Expert arborists have been working with these teams providing recommendations and advice on the difficult decision of either the removal or very heavy pruning of trees considered dangerous or unlikely to survive.

Other roadside cleanup efforts, have been delayed pending the completion of tree works but are gearing up. In Kinglake around 80% of the street name signs are now reinstated. Guideposts and other signs are steadily being replaced.

Works on the Kinglake Glenburn Road are close to completion. Guide posts are to be replaced by end of May and the centre line at the southern end, to be remarked by late June. Works in other fire affected sections of the Kinglake area include Extons Road and the side roads off the Whittlesea Kinglake Road.

In Marysville both surface and underground drainage work is underway and should be completed by early June. Similar works are also scheduled for Kinglake.

TN drops in on the Creative Triangle

TN decided to make an impromptu visit to Butters Café to see how the newly formed Creative Triangle (also known as Alice's Patchwork Group) were going.

It is a very cheerful group. Some are very skilled in quilting and others are learning to quilt or knit or embroider. Some were not working on anything at all but just enjoying watching what was happening around them. It seems that all have found an excellent tonic to help with those post-fire blues. A couple of hours of camaraderie and a cuppa with like-minded people who had shared similar experiences seem to work wonders.

Alice Stinear was the lady who got this group going. You may remember her story in TN some months ago – 'Beginning Again'. Alice lost everything in the fires but when her step-sister-in-law told the story in the internet Alice was inundated with fabrics, threads needles etc by the generosity of quilters and sewers not just from around Australia but around the world. Alice said that without the support and friendship she received from Lilli Roberts this group may not have begun. Lilli provided a place to store and display the fabrics donated and also welcomed ladies to her home where they could receive fabrics and sewing notions so that they might be able to resume their patchwork/quilting or embroidery craft. Since Easter Alice has begun teaching a class for those wishing to begin patchwork and quilting. Over the coming months the Creative Triangle will receive visits from several experienced quilters and embroiders who will teach classes to the group.

All the ladies agreed that they love going to the group at Butters Café on Thursday afternoons 1 – 3pm. They enjoy the camaraderie and appreciate the generosity of owners Gaby and Barb for providing their café for a meeting place.

We admired a basket of what we thought were just-picked Australian bush flowers, though obviously not from this burnt out area. Imagine our amazement when we discovered that they were not real – that they had been so accurately hand crafted by Lynn! The talent in this group is amazing. And those just learning craft for the first time did not seem in the least intimidated by the greater talent around them - so friendly was everyone.

Gaby and Barb spent many years building their straw bale and mud café and home themselves. They fought so hard to save it all in the fires but they lost most of their olive grove of beautiful maturing trees and some of their food producing garden. They appreciate that they were able to save their building, and like so many in our community, choose to share their good fortune with others.
