## MAYORS CHAIR

We have had an extremely busy week in the shire over the past week with some significant events occurring and a sharp burst of wintery weather. We here at council hope you are all keeping warm and comfortable as we get through this period.

From Friday until Sunday (24 – 26 July) the Kinglake/Flowerdale area received a visit from Her Excellency, the Governor General of Australia, Ms Quentin Bryce, AC and her husband, His Excellency Mr Michael Bryce, AM AE.

Mr and Ms Bryce, along with Christine Nixon, Chair of the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority, attended Middle Kinglake Primary School on Friday; the Lakers/Poweltown football match on Saturday; hosted a lunch for some local women, including some of our wonderful emergency services staff; the opening of the Bendigo Bank; then attended the Community Services Hub and the temporary villages in Kinglake and then Flowerdale.

We would like to express our sincere thanks to the Governor General and her husband for their mostly private time with the people of our community. They truly show their compassion and the government's determination in their understanding and assisting the shire and its people.

As mentioned above, the Bendigo Bank opened a branch in Kinglake over the weekend with festivities and a sausage sizzle. The Bank also sponsored the inaugural Bendigo Cup football match in which Poweltown came out the winners over Kinglake after a great match!

On Tuesday 21 July, Sports Minister James Merlino, Bill Shorten MP and Member for Seymour Ben Hardman announced a funding package of \$500,000 to facilitate recovery at five shire locations: Narbethong Cross Country Jeep Club, Marysville Cricket Club, Marysville Swimming Pool, Flowerdale Tennis Club and Kinglake Pony Club - each received \$100,000. Our grateful thanks for these important grants.

Friday 24 July saw two the visit of Forbes (NSW) Shire Council to Alexandra, Marysville and Narbethong. In the aftermath of the February fires, Forbes residents and council have donated 14 pallets of household and personal goods. This visit was to officially "hand over" the donations and visit the impacted areas. We thank

the good people of Forbes for their wonderful donation.

The second visit (in Kinglake and surrounds) was from the Swan Hill Rural Council who presented the council with a \$10,000 for assisting in the development of Bolly Gum Park. From all the people in our shire, we express our sincere appreciation for their timely and heartfelt donation.

The State Emergency Services (our good friends, the SES) were based at the Kinglake West Mechanics Hall over the past weekend with the daylight hours seeing them in almost every property over the region donating their time and tools assisting our people with the clean up process. Words cannot express the shire's thanks – from a council and personal viewpoint, our deepest gratitude.

Councillors have also attended the following events over the past week: the CFA Annual Board meeting; UGFM radio appearances; a special meeting of the Section 86 (Bushfire recovery) meeting; Drought Committee Meeting; RSL Funding Announcement.

### Council Information Kits Help Businesses Recover From Bushfires

Murrindindi Shire Council has assembled information kits to assist food and accommodation businesses re-establish their premises after the bushfires.

Seventy-two registered food and health businesses including restaurants, bed and breakfasts, cafes, hotels and conference centres were lost in the Murrindindi shire during the bushfires.

The information kits have been prepared with a wealth of useful information to assist in the business registration process. Fact sheets on new Australian standards, current building guidelines and food handling requirements have been compiled together with a variety of posters and leaflets as well as the applicable registration application forms for new food and accommodation businesses.

Natalie Stewart, Environmental Health Officer for the Murrindindi Shire Council said everyone rebuilding a food or accommodation business needed to know and comply with a range of new Australian regulations. Introduced in recent years the rules and regulations are aimed at further enhancing health and safety standards.

The information kits include the latest details and are designed to make it easier for food and accommodation businesses to understand these requirements.

In a move to further ease the financial burden on businesses Council has decided to refund the full 2009 registration fees paid by all registered commercial premises destroyed by the fires.

Says Natalie, "We are keen to support and provide help wherever possible to those intending to rebuild their business. Anyone needing advice or assistance is welcome to call me at the council offices on 03 5772 0377."

The information kits will be posted directly to all affected registered businesses shortly.

# **MARYSVILLE TRIANGLE COMMUNITY RECOVERY COMMITTEE** **(MTCRC)**

The MTCRC has been officially formed, with representatives now in place to take the community forward during the rebuilding and recovery of Marysville and Triangle.

The MTCRC was formed by Murrindindi Shire with the support of VBRRRA to develop a partnership between the affected communities and agencies involved in recovery, including local government, state and federal governments, local non-government agencies and other organizations.

In particular, the community recovery committee will play a key role as the main community advisory body to the local Council (via its Section 86 Committee) and the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority (VBRRRA) on key issues effecting community recovery, and to support the Council's role in municipal recovery co-ordination.

Representatives of the of the committee are as listed in last week's issue of the Triangle News

MTCRC Chairman Tony Thompson said the committee would have access to a range of resources, and assist with projects that require funding submissions.

"We hope that the processes and procedure we have in place through this committee will provide key community and business projects with the best possible chance of succeeding," Mr Thompson said.

He said the MTCRC would also be the key driver in the development of Community Recovery Plans, which will establish the priorities for rebuilding and community recovery.

"Council, VBRRRA and the community will be relying on MTCRC to make sure rebuilding projects have had maximum community consultation, before being approved and submitted to VBRRRA," he said. "This will mean that communications will be stepped up to a new level, using a range of websites and advertising and a mail out, with the help from local council, to all residents of Marysville including those of who are spread far and wide."

Mr Thompson said there was good news for the Marysville community, with planning was well underway for a number of key community projects.

Projects currently being developed in Marysville include the Gallipoli Park project, with new rotundas, an adventure playground, BBQs and shelters.

Options for a multi function community building are being considered and will be submitted to the community at a public meeting for final approval.

The new Narbethong Community Hall project will be included as a priority in the Community Recovery Plan which is being developed by the Marysville District Community Recovery Committee.

The Narbethong Hall was destroyed on 7th February and the Hall Committee has been busy making the necessary arrangements to rebuild. Community consultation commenced in the second week of March, and the Committee has secured the pro-bono services of Emergency Architects Australia, BVN Architects, Rodney Aujard and Associates, and Engineering consultants ARUP. BVN Architects are working on concept drawings for a multi-purpose community centre in Narbethong, which will be presented to the community for feedback in August.

Negotiations with Government Departments, including Department of Planning and Community Development, and VBRA for funding to supplement insurance have been underway since late February. Now that the Murrindindi Council's Section 86 Committee has been formed, the Hall Committee are optimistic that funding will be committed soon.

Additionally, work is progressing on the development of a community learning, health and recreation hub that includes a new primary school and childrens' centre, community health building and a recreation facility.

## Goalposts back at Marysville

The 'Footy at Marysville' group has taken a big step forward in its objective of re-developing football, and eventually Netball activity in the District. An association is soon to be incorporated under the name of Marysville District Football & Netball Club Inc., (MDFNC Inc.) which will allow for legitimate membership growth and fund raising. 'Marysville District' will include Marysville, Narbethong, Buxton and Taggerty

At a meeting on Saturday July 4th, a Management Committee was formed and will comprise:

John Phillips (President), Leigh Jowett (Vice President), Bill Metcalfe (Secretary), Barry Bird (Treasurer) and committee members Nat Morandi and Terry Ross.

One of the first priorities will be to get the ground at Gallipoli Park ready for Wayne Bisset's annual Pub match between Buxton and Marysville/Narbethong on Sunday October 11th. This will see a set of AFL approved Goal/Point posts installed at the ground in the forthcoming weeks. This match has steadily grown in popularity and Wayne has taken this year's event to a new level with some additional exciting entertainment.

Next year should see further additions to Football infrastructure at the ground and a number of high quality games being staged at Marysville. John Phillips has had discussions with the CEO's of three major Football Leagues and they have shown great support towards the concept of locating fixtured games at the venue, including a Final. There is also the possibility of a pre-season inter league match in March 2010, which would bring an elite level of Football to the area.

As the community and facilities are re-built, the Committee will continue to develop the above program and also encourage School use and promotional activities such as Auskick, AFL player visits and Social use. When the timing is right it is also planned to examine the feasibility of putting teams on the field.

"The development of a competing club would be a fantastic outcome, but planning will need to be closely scrutinised to ensure ongoing viability", John Phillips said recently. "We have an organisation in mind which specialises in this type of feasibility study, and with the assistance of the Victorian Country Football League, we hope to be looking at this in 2-3 years time. We are also very keen to talk to people with Netball experience to help develop this vital component", he said.

Funding for some of these activities has been assisted by private donations and support from the VCFL's Bushfire Relief Fund. The VCFL has been fantastic with support and general assistance according to John, but the project will also need community support. This is now possible through a Membership offer which will contribute directly to the activities outlined.

To become a Member of the MDFNC and help support the cause, the following options are available:

Junior (Under 18) - \$6.00 (Includes 1 off joining fee of \$5.00)

Adult Member - \$10.00 (Includes joining fee \$5.00)

This inaugural offer will carry membership rights until 31/12/10.

Paid up members will receive free or reduced admission to MDFNC events during this period and there will be additional benefits forwarded as the program develops.

These fees have deliberately been kept very low to try and gain maximum community support. At this early stage, the aim is to get people from the region back together at the footy.
