



Fighting Fire with Fire – a Bioenergy Power Plant for Marysville

Invitation to the Release of a Feasibility Study

Marysville Golf Club, Noon, Friday 7th August

In the wake of the February 7th bushfire tragedy follows the long and arduous process of community reconstruction; a process requiring spirited action and innovative thinking - ensuring that the mistakes of the past are not repeated.

With the challenges of reconstruction also come opportunities. It is the potential of a bioenergy power plant for the Marysville & Triangle district that has been identified by two local companies (TreePower Australia from Taggerty, and Gasification Australia from Strath Creek), as a community owned and operated project.

They have conducted a feasibility study into the design and installation of a biomass-fired power plant in the local region, initially utilising locally-sourced fire-damaged trees as a source of renewable energy.

The Feasibility Study report will be formally released at Marysville Golf Club at noon on Friday 7th August, six months to the date after the February 7 fires.

You are invited to attend this important event, to learn more about this bioenergy project, and to participate in assisting with the reconstruction of Marysville and the Triangle region.
