Hi to all in the Village.

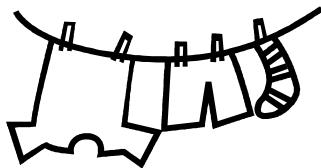

This Christmas, The Salvation Army is offering gift vouchers from various retailers.

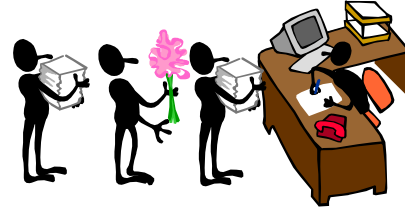
