

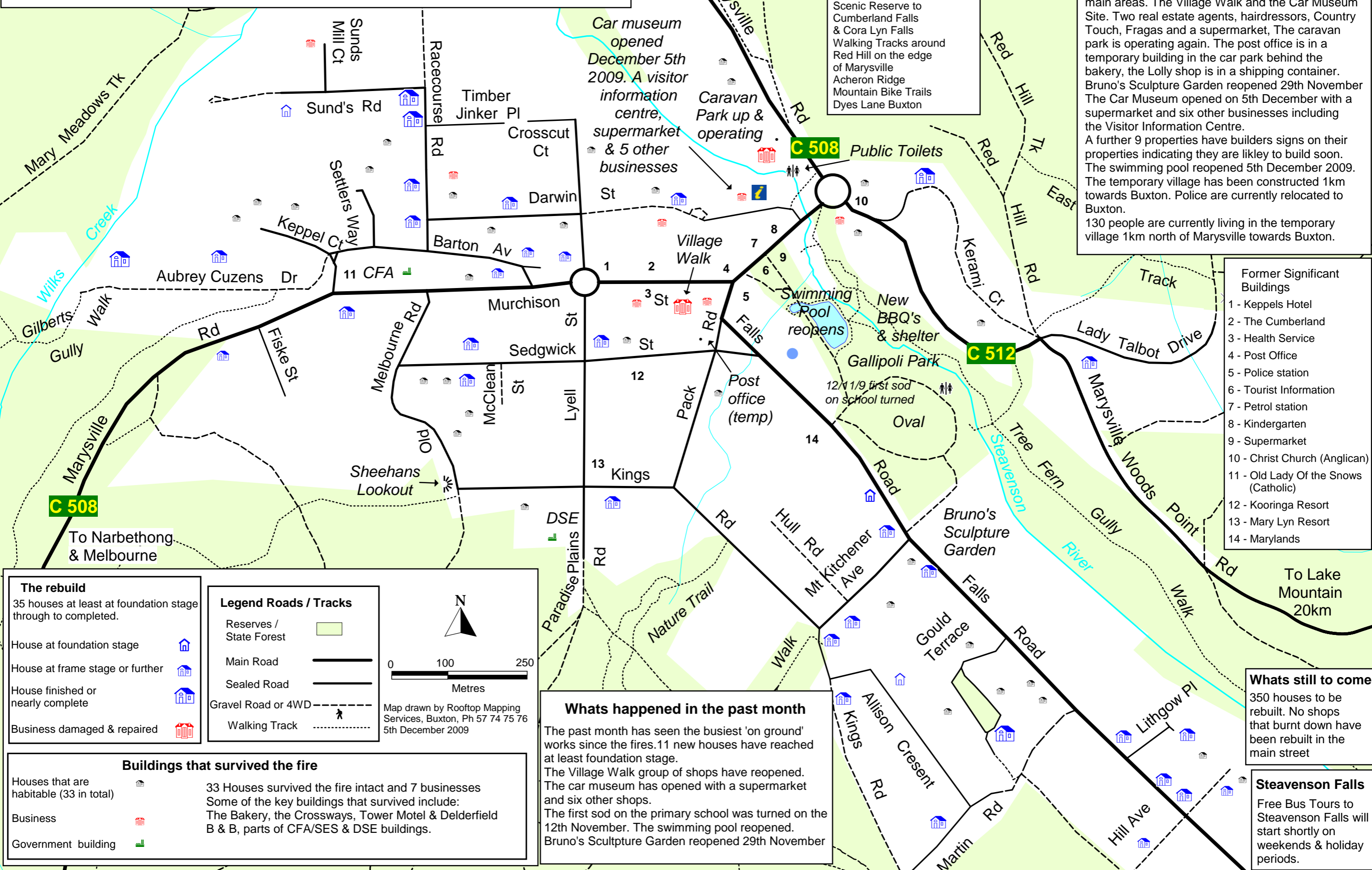
Marysville - The rebuild after 10 months

General Notes - The Rebuild
 Last mapping of buildings occurred 1st December 2009. 35 houses have reached at least foundation stage. About 13 new retail businesses are back up and functioning. The business are located in two main areas. The Village Walk and the Car Museum Site. Two real estate agents, hairdressors, Country Touch, Fragas and a supermarket, The caravan park is operating again. The post office is in a temporary building in the car park behind the bakery, the Lolly shop is in a shipping container. Bruno's Sculpture Garden reopened 29th November. The Car Museum opened on 5th December with a supermarket and six other businesses including the Visitor Information Centre.
 A further 9 properties have builders signs on their properties indicating they are likely to build soon. The swimming pool reopened 5th December 2009. The temporary village has been constructed 1km towards Buxton. Police are currently relocated to Buxton.
 130 people are currently living in the temporary village 1km north of Marysville towards Buxton.

 The first sod on the primary school was turned on the 12th November. The swimming pool reopened.
