**3. Meeting**

**3.1 David Clark, VBRRA**

Tony Thompson opened the special meeting by thanking David Clark for all of his assistance to date and for his participation in the Marysville and Triangle Community Recovery Committee. David Clark will continue to do some work for VBRRA. Howard Paix echoed Tony's comments from the Murrindindi Shire Council's perspective.

**3.2 Kerry O'Neill (VBRRA) – Urban Design Framework (UDF) for Marysville**

Seventy three submissions have been received as part of the consultation process for the UDF. Comments include:

- Images depicted in the UDF were too modern, some people thought they did not reflect the rural sub alpine nature of Marysville
- The original proposal to limit development outside the town attracted some attention. Proposals outside will have to demonstrate a tourism benefit and a benefit to the whole town.
- Industrial zone – a temporary site has been established at Cooks Mill site but further work needs to be done to find a long term industrial land use location.
- Performing arts centre needs to be noted however has to be based on a sound business case.
- Follow up submissions can be discussed at a meeting on 5<sup>th</sup> November at 11.30am. It is anticipated that the UDF will be adopted by Council on 12<sup>th</sup> November.

CRC comments included:

- The status of the amphitheatre- Kerry O'Neill replied that it did not have a lot of support at the moment
- Some people did not understand that the pictures used in the UDF document were illustrative only, not prescriptive.

- How Council is bound by the UDF in its decision making process.
- Architecture and design is a personal choice, people should be open to new ideas.
- Tony Thompson tabled the feasibility study for the Performing Arts Centre for the CRC to review.

### 3.3 Community Recovery Projects

Megan Lancaster advised that she had been in meetings all day to discuss the CR projects process. Between now and Christmas VBAF will meet four times to discuss CR projects. The CRC needs to identify it's new top priorities given that some have now been funded.

The review of the projects produced a new list – 26 projects have been listed as high priority. Other projects were listed as medium or low. Some were 'parked' as they would not meet VBAF funding criteria.

Please refer to the summary document for details of the new priority list.

Action items arising from the discussions:

1. Richard Rogerson to write to Rotary on behalf of the CRC to see if Rotary could assist in funding equipment for the Brownies.
2. Bruce Ackerman to submit a new Community Recovery template for the replacement of pedestrian bridges.

The projects now listed as 'High' will need further information such as firm costs and other sources of funding.

### 3.4 Other

1. A letter has been received from Murrindindi Shire Council outlining how much money has been allocated to the CRC budget. Administrative expenses are to be sought from this fund.
2. Triangle Roadside Flowers Project template needs to be discussed at the next meeting.
