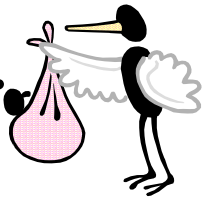

## It's a girl!!!!!!



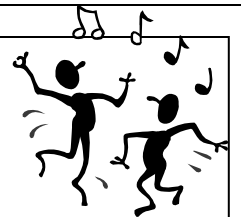

A few dogs have been noticed wandering unsupervised around the Village.

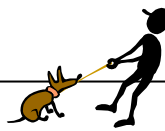
This poses a safety risk for other residents and their pets as well as a hygiene problem as they are not being picked up after.

Please make sure you are doing your bit to ensure we all enjoy living in the Village.

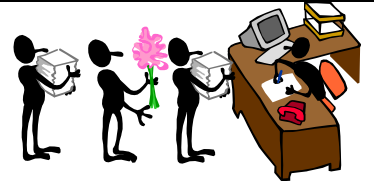
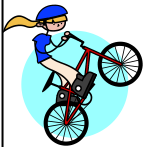


## MATERIAL AID CENTRE

# Hot Summer Days

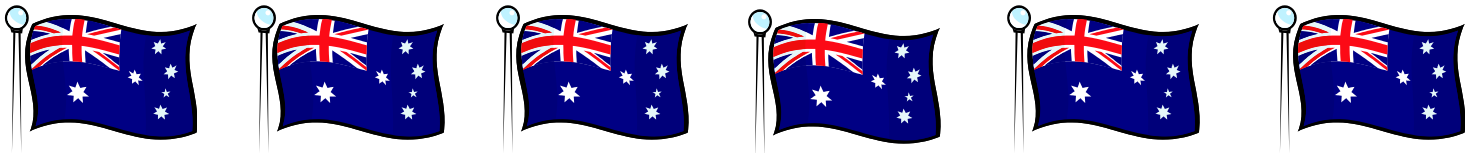
It's summer and those scorching summer days are here already. Great to see so many utilizing the local pool - isn't the refurbishment super?

On CODE RED (CATASTROPHIC) Fire Danger Days the Manager's Office will be closed and the Village Manager will be available by phone: 0458 938 306

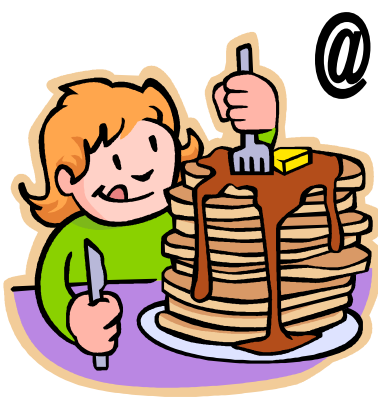
On days of Severe, Extreme or Code Red Fire Danger - the Village Manager will convene a meeting the night before - at 6pm in Kim's Kitchen.
