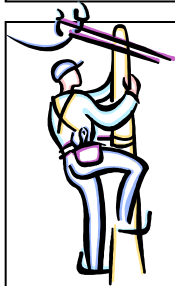

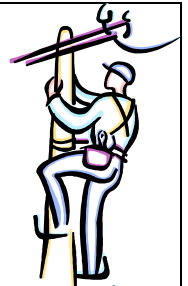

9am - 5pm

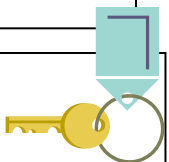


Electricians will be in the Village next Wednesday to connect the large generator into the village power network. To do this they will require time to make all of the safe connections and adjustments.

This will require the Village to be without power for a significant portion of the day. Please make alternative arrangements as you need to.

I have had assurances that they will keep power interruptions to a minimum. Works will be postponed if the weather is inclement (wet & rainy).

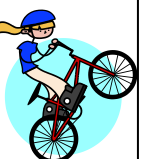
Look left, Look right, Look Bike!!

Please remember some of our residents live near the laundry and we'd like to make sure they have a quiet restful sleep as well.

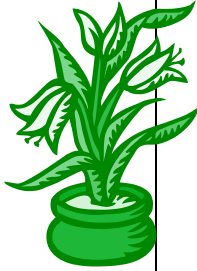
