General Notes - The Rebuild

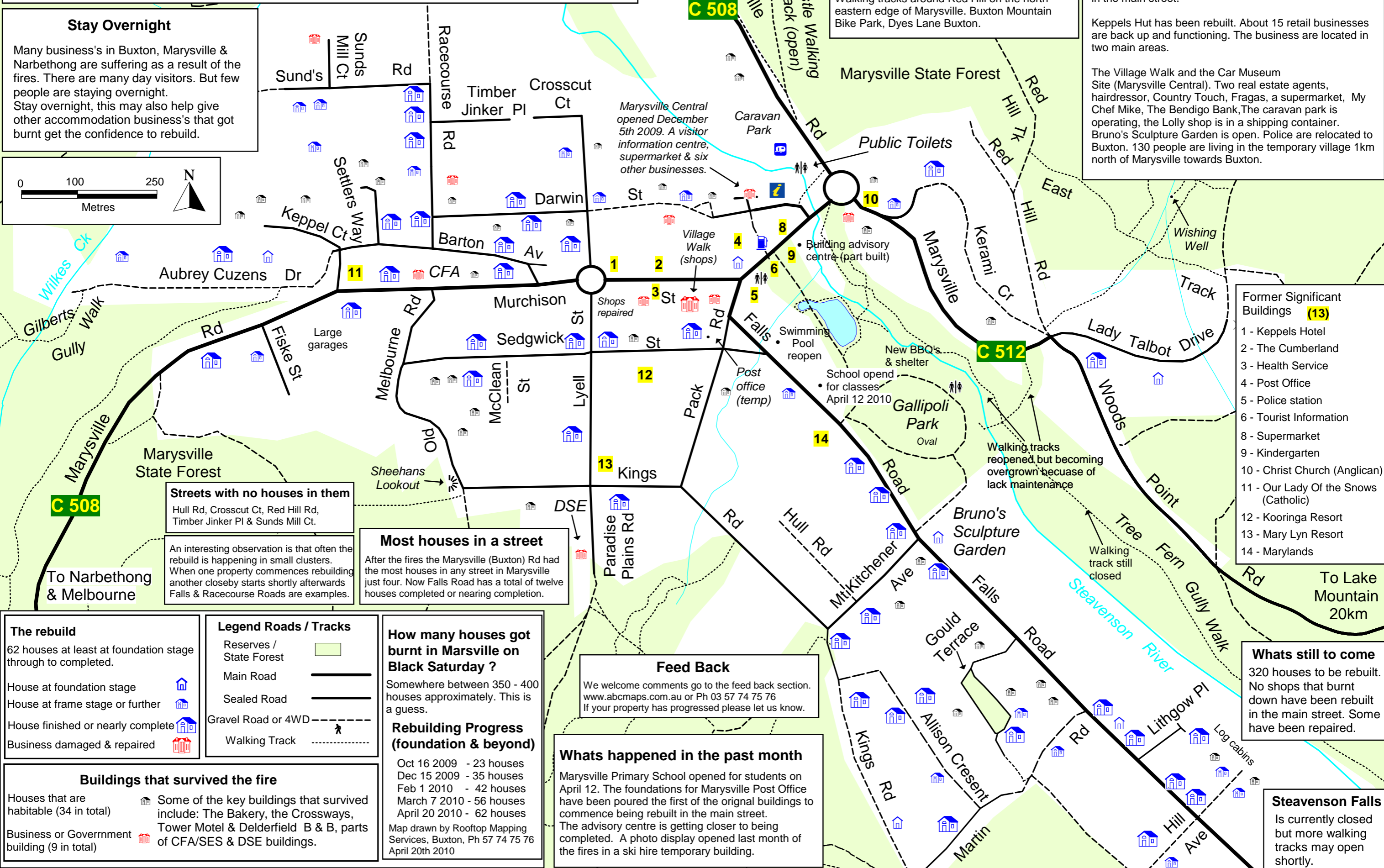
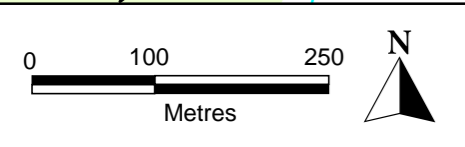
Last mapping of buildings occurred on April 20th 2010. 62 houses have reached at least foundation stage. The school opened for classes on April 12. Foundations have been poured for the Post Office. Marysville Advisory Centre is getting closer to completion in the main street.

Keppels Hut has been rebuilt. About 15 retail businesses are back up and functioning. The business are located in two main areas.

The Village Walk and the Car Museum Site (Marysville Central). Two real estate agents, hairdresser, Country Touch, Fragas, a supermarket, My Chef Mike, The Bendigo Bank, The caravan park is operating, the Lolly shop is in a shipping container. Bruno's Sculpture Garden is open. Police are relocated to Buxton. 130 people are living in the temporary village 1km north of Marysville towards Buxton.

Stay Overnight

Many business's in Buxton, Marysville & Narbethong are suffering as a result of the fires. There are many day visitors. But few people are staying overnight. Stay overnight, this may also help give other accommodation business's that got burnt get the confidence to rebuild.

After the fires the Marysville (Buxton) Rd had the most houses in any street in Marysville just four. Now Falls Road has a total of twelve houses completed or nearing completion.

Whats happened in the past month

Marysville Primary School opened for students on April 12. The foundations for Marysville Post Office have been poured the first of the original buildings to commence being rebuilt in the main street. The advisory centre is getting closer to being completed. A photo display opened last month of the fires in a ski hire temporary building.

Whats still to come

320 houses to be rebuilt. No shops that burnt down have been rebuilt in the main street. Some have been repaired.

Stevenson Falls
