Having grown up in the country, Bridget was so smitten with Marysville (a sentiment that was strongly reciprocated by all who met her there) she bought a block of land there in late 2009.

Bridget is currently dealing with a major health issue and those who have known her either as a friend or through working together have been wondering what they can do to offer her love and support.

ROTARY AND BUSH FIRE RECOVERY



May Update



The Rotary Club of Alexandra is continuing with recovery projects. Over the last fifteen months these total over thirty projects, ranging from the initial relief period, from catering and handling donated goods, to provision of sheds and vouchers, to sponsoring events such as the Marysville Marathon and Craft Gathering run by Community Health.

This club has received and largely distributed over \$260,000 in direct donations, together with over \$300,000 in Donated Materials such as the Bayside Builders Sheds, so our contribution to bush fire relief and recovery has approached \$600,000.

We are delighted that Marysville Central Shopping Centre has proved such a success, as this club first suggested the idea and the combined Rotary Districts of Victoria and Tasmania have contributed nearly \$400,000 to its completion.

All in all, the Rotary movement has injected well over one million dollars into bush fire recovery projects in the Triangle / Alexandra area.

This club's most recent projects have included helping with the barbecue shelter built by Alexandra Truck & Ute Show Committee at Gallipoli Park in Marysville, \$5,000 to the Plantaid Community Nursery at Marysville and over \$18,000 to six CFA Brigades for equipment needs not funded by the CFA. This project continues.

Another successful project has been the community garden at the Marysville Temporary Housing Village, where completion was helped by a days work from the Rotary Group Study Exchange Team from Iowa, USA. This garden is now being put to good use by the residents. We are also working with the Shire on projects in Narbethong.

The Rotary Club of Alexandra is now seeking expressions of interest in another issue of vouchers, funded by Rotary and Mitchell Community Health. These vouchers will be for garden plants and gardening equipment for families who are in the process of rebuilding their homes and are ready to establish their new gardens. Vouchers of \$100 denomination, with a limit of \$500 per family, are redeemable in Triangle / Alexandra district stores, garden suppliers and nurseries. *See the Advertisement in the Alexandra Standard for details.*

We thank DMK Wealth, Grant Street Alexandra, and in particular Marianne Raymond for again handling our voucher issue. Marianne will require evidence of rebuilding, such as a copy of their building permit, and proof of identity such as *blue card* and drivers licence.

This will be an on-going project and will be available to locals who lost their homes in the Narbethong, Marysville, Buxton and Taggerty area. The vouchers will be available when people are ready to establish their gardens.
